Editorial

From the past - Sandown Relays, 1993

This Editor fellow thought he might look back in time and just see how our current athletes compare to the times of the past.

For those who can remember 30 years ago....

We searched our archives and found these results from 1993. It's an interesting comparison, with our current team. We had a very high standard team back then with Australian representatives. We placed 6^{th} in A Grade in this race with our leading athlete at the time, Malcolm Norwood, recording a super time of 17: 50.

Our current team is a very young outfit, but is not far away from catching up to the exploits of 30 years ago. I am incredibly proud of our current group which compares quite well with our team in 1993. That team consisted of "seasoned veterans".

Talking about the old days...

Spoke to John Boas about his memories of the past hoping to give us some insights of the 1960s. John delved into his excellent filing system which showed we have been competing at Sandown for a very long time.

A quote from John:

"I found the results for the Sandown relays on Saturday14th August 1965. Ivanhoe finished 5th in C grade. The team and their times were Hugh Carter 24:09

Nick Hoogenraad 20:01

Andy(?) McInnes 24:59

Bob Cochrane 21:46

Ray Brown 19:57

Trevor Whitehead 23:08

Hugh, Andy and Trevor were juniors (under 19).

Total time (6 x 2 laps) 134m.00 s

For interest, the A grade race was won by Glenhuntly with a time of 109 m 38 secs. Some notable individual times: Pat Clohessy 18:19; John Coyle 18:03; Trevor Vincent 18:32; Henk Van Winjgarten 18:54; Ron Clarke 17:30; Tony Cook 18:20. Second were St Stephens 114m.13s (Derek Clayton 18:19). For those who know their history of Australian athletics, Ron Clarke and Derek Clayton should be recognisable names, but Trevor Vincent and Tony Cook were 1964 Olympians (3000m steeple and 10 000m respectively) and Pat Clohessy was a 1962 Commonwealth Games representative (and later the driving force as the coach behind the revival of Australian distance running from the mid-1970s onwards).

Ivanhoe won the 1966 C grade Road Premiership- our first for a very long time (If not the first ever). We won all 3 events. "

Editor note: Thanks John for those memories. In those times there was a separate "Road Racing Premiership" over 3 events and a separate Cross Country Premiership. These days the winter Premiership is contested over ten events, both road racing and cross country racing.
