President's Report

It has been a privilege to serve as President of our historic Club during the 2022/23 season. We have made steady progress over the past few years and managed to navigate through the COVID interruptions of the recent past. Ivanhoe Harriers Athletic Club is a unique community club having the ability to bring many people together through local schools, community, physical fitness and the sport of athletics.

There were a number of highlights during the 2022/23 season. From an athletics performance point of view, our second placing in Division 4 Cross Country was a great achievement. The final Ladder position gained us promotion to Division 3 for next season. A very satisfying result, emphasizing our current strength in middle distance running.

In summer Track and Field competition the Club made solid progress with a 15% increase in performance points and a 37% increase in events contested compared to last season. The team competed in 343 events, significantly up on recent years. This increase in participation was largely driven by the growth in our girls' team which also added enthusiasm, noise and vitality to the athlete group. A very exciting summer.

Our close relationship with Ivanhoe Grammar School, our provision of training, coaching and mentoring of young athletes has also been very pleasing. We enjoy solid support from the senior management at the school, in particular, Chris Branigan, Anna Geoghegan, Luke Lochrane and Emma Linke.

In terms of our finances, we have grown our balance sheet by 17% with cash on hand of \$25,578.00 and total net worth of circa \$35,000.00 which is inclusive of uniform stock and equipment. This progress is due to the commitment and effort from parents and Committee who have collectively worked to make this happen. I sincerely thank my Committee for their support and hard work during the past few years.

The trivia night profit of \$3,665.00 was a record for the Club. Support of our Members and sponsors was fantastic. Every member of Committee contributed to the running of the Club but in particular, the contribution of John Edney in running the Trivia Night was, once again, outstanding. Apart from the fund-raising, the fun and social aspect was a highlight.

The Club needs to continue to grow its financial strength in order that we are in a healthy position to finance future equipment. At this stage, we understand the rebuild of clubrooms at Chelsworth Park is hoped to commence in 2023. That rebuild will include a weight training room to be shared with other resident Old Ivanhoe Grammarian clubs at Chelsworth Park. Therefore, we will have a future funding obligation for weight training equipment in the next 2-3 years.

Our partnership with Old Ivanhoe Grammarians' continues to develop and we are working together to improve our visibility on Facebook and Instagram. We are confident that this deepening of our relationship with Ivanhoe Grammar School is improving the visibility of athletics at the school, particularly as we strive to promote participation in female athletics.

The support of past members has been wonderful. This season we had 18 non-competing members in our ranks, 31 athletes a total of 66 members inclusive of Life Members.

Our Committee over these past few years has been very stable with each individual donating their valuable time to the Club. We are a very diverse group and have achieved much on our journey as Club caretakers. My sincere thanks to John Edney, David Burke, Barry Greig, Michael Wallis, Braden Fraser, Richard Russell, Glenn Morrison, Michael Linke, Anne Bukovsan and James Lynch for their support and professionalism.

Some of the performances were outstanding, David Greig competed in 8 events and Ben Morrison competed in 9. Ben, in particular was our lone competitor at Ballarat and in the Half Marathon. He carried the team on his shoulders in those 2 events, single handedly earning 11 premiership points - a mighty effort.

David Greig had a fine season, just doing enough to earn a spot in the National Cross Country Championships where he placed 30th. He placed 20th in the Bundoora 10km CC in the time of 32:12 and placed 47th in the 12km CC in a time of 41:00, both performances very good. Claude Aquino competed in 6 rounds of competition and Tom Langdon in 5 rounds before he went overseas and the evergreens, Barry Greig and David Burke also managed 5 events.

Four of our girls contested some relays and 3km events during the winter culminating in a successful Tan Relays at the end of the season. Paige, Kate and Eliza competed 4 times which was a good effort.

Special mention to Paige Bukovsan who ran in the Ekiden Relay to ensure we had a team on the day, well done Paige.

Overall, a great team effort, everyone contributed.

The handicaps worked out pretty well, thanks to Barry Greig. Our winner was Paige Bukovsan with a very good time of 25:16, beating her handicap time by 14 seconds. Jeremy Kerner had his first run for the Club and was the only other runner to beat his handicap time, by just one second, to record the very good time of 22:29. Ben Morrison was our fastest time with an excellent 22:07.

Track & Field Report

Full results for the 2022/23 season are covered in detail, in a spreadsheet in this report.

In summary, our athletes contested 343 events during the 10 Round season and the finals. This is a significant increase on previous years and shows a great deal of improvement, determination and team spirit.

The AVSL system allocates points to athletes based on a formula which measures the quality of the performance, having regard to the age and sex of the athlete etc. As a rule of thumb, any performance earning 300 points and above is considered a creditable performance, over 400 points is considered a high standard.

Our athletes consistently achieved scores at or above those benchmarks which indicates a very talented squad.

The contribution of our athletes to point scoring was outstanding. Over the season Kate Bukovsan was our top points earner with 11,493, just ahead of our evergreen David Burke with 10,908, Alex Linke 7850, Barry Greig 6964, Ben Morrison 5456, Perrin Theocharides 6266 and Eliza Nelson 6491.

We had a number of athletes contest the Victorian Championships and the Victorian Track Relay Championships (see charts below).

However, our finest result was a new Club Record in the Women's U16, U18, U20 and Open 4x400m relay in a time of 4:38.10.

The format of the current AVSL points competition rewards volume performances which benefits the very large Clubs with large memberships.
